NOTES FROM THE FALL RALLY TECH TALK

Insects

Ants and insects can climb the power cord to the kitchen. Can come up tire. Put deterrent around places on the RV that contacts with ground.

RAID flying insect spray.

Amdro fire ant killer. https://www.amdro.com/all-products/fire-ant-bait.

Borax.

Terro for ants. http://www.terro.com/store/ants

Water heater maintenance.

Check the sacrificial anode annually; replace if too far gone.

Pop off valve may be prone to failure. Water impurities can get into the ring that closes off the plug. Can replace from hardware store for much less than from Camping World or RV store. Check for insect nests and clear out anything you find.

Q: Do flea collars work? A: No.

You can take a turkey baster to drain the dregs out of the water heater when winterizing. Then squirt in some RV antifreeze.

Winterizing

Get a screw-in plug for the city water adapter. Connect a compressor and set for 40 pounds. Blow the water out of the lines. It cleans out enough to protect from freezing. Add some antifreeze to all the traps: shower, kitchen sink, bathroom sink. Pour a couple of cups down the toilet.

Window Blinds

There's a double loop of thread that holds the tension on your blinds. It ties around a plastic bobbin that holds the string under pressure. There are YouTube videos to show that threading pattern. There's a document in the Chinook Club folder that shows how to rethread.

Electronics

Whirring noise behind the converter is a cooling fan.

If you have the original converter in your Chinook it always charges at a steady rate. It is not a good match with AGM batteries, which have separate charging cycles. Charge Wizard three stage charger gives better efficiency. Resource http://www.bestconverter.com: talk to Randy about what model you need.

Crutchfield Electronics is the BEST source for audio equipment. https://www.crutchfield.com

Dashboard radio replacement connects to high res back up camera, interfaces with apple and Android smart phones, SiriusXM radio. https://www.crutchfield.com/p 130AV2550/Pioneer-AVH-2550NEX.html

A trickle charger maintains a steady charge. A float charger provides different charging cycles depending on

what the battery needs. T has a solar trickle charger which is so inefficient its seems to work fine. https://www.amazon.com/Sunway-Solar-Maintainer-Motorcycle-Snowmobile/dp/Bo6WP95W51

Tires:

Terry is recommending replacement for Michelins (did away with LTX). Sumitmoto makes a quality replacement for much less than the \$1200 for Michelin. http://www.sumitomotire.com/Home/SplashPage

Borg tire extenders are a great add on. Air tight, and make refilling easy. https://yourtireshopsupply.com/manufacturer/38/borg-equipment. Don't let anyone put on rubber valve stems.

ETC

J-B Weld

Quick setting epoxy. https://www.amazon.com/J-B-Weld-8276-KwikWeld-Reinforced/dp/B0006O1lCY. Good fast setting repair resource.

Q: When do you use DC on the fridge?

A: When you don't have AC or propane, but it will run the batter down fast. Okay if driving because it keeps charging, but if parked it will run battery dry.

There should not be a propane smell ever. Can happen because tank is overfilled, can be loose pressure regulator, can be a cracked cook top. Keep propane alarm in repair. Maintain the tank: keep rust off and paint with Rustolium or similar product.

Rotten egg smell means sanitize your water system. Starts with the water heater, moves to the grey water tank. Change the anode rod if you have to do this or else you won't get the bacteria.

Black water tank heater will kick in when temperature goes below 40°.

Slow Drain

Place 3 tablespoons of baking soda down the drain, followed by a cup of white vinegar. Let it sit for several hours or overnight, and then rinse it down with very hot water.

Testing brake fluid: two types of testers. Electric tester tests for moister. When moister heats up it turns to steam and causes brake failure.
