TECH NOTES FROM THE WINTER RALLY

If you haven't yet attended a rally, here's a tip—at each rally we try to have a tech tips, troubles and triumphs session. Owners bring their questions and problems, and others in the club help them try to sort out the solutions. We also share information on improvements and changes we've made to our coaches. At this session we tackled ideas for making the couch bed more comfortable. Solutions included getting a custom foam topper from an upholstery store, respringing the bed to make it more firm, using thermarest camping pads, putting plywood between the springs and cushion, and using a duvet cover with a granny feather bed. Just a few of the many suggestions!

Other issues discussed included replacing the fluorescent lights with LEDs, info on satellite dish wiring, door and compartment sealing gaskets, rain water in the battery compartment, generator replacement, solar panel additions and making sure we check and replace propane and carbon monoxide monitor alarms on the five year life cycle.

Improvements included **Jim Day**'s new storm door, **Bill Cristophersen'**s Venturi generator vent, **Liz Newell'**s dowel and curtain replacement for the shades, and **Nita Wilkinson**'s new headlights that we watched **Greg Snedden** install.

These tip sessions are invaluable for learning more about our coaches, especially as they age and begin to have more issues. And it's great to see what others have done to improve comfort, ride, technology and storage!

HELPFUL WEBSITES and ADDITIONAL TECH NOTES Tech That Enhances the Ride - Part 1 by Mark McCluski (Thanks, Mark!)

We all of us know Yelp. Most of us know Trip Advisor. As RVers you probably know All Stays Camp and RV. Information available to us when we're on the road has certainly come a long way from when we had to carry guidebooks the size of a Manhattan telephone directory. Planning routes and finding resources on the road has never been easier. It can be hard to winnow out the tools which can make your ride a little more carefree, though.

Mobile Internet Resource Center

Connectivity is at the core of a lot of these things, so let's talk first about the Mobile Internet Resource Center at RVMobileInternet.com. Their mission statement reads

Mobile Internet

"We offer unbiased mobile internet information specifically for US based RVers and Cruisers. We research the options, share our personal & professional experience and analyze industry news... so you can focus on what drives you."

They go on to describe the website: "This website is our repository of knowledge on this niche topic and news stories analyzed just for travelers. We've been building this since 2013, and there's a lot of content (currently over 900 unique pages!).

"Here are the main areas of the website:

- News We track the mobile internet industry to keep an eye out for news releases about products & services.
 We then analyze those stories for how it impacts travelers keeping connected.
- <u>Guides</u> Our guides are in-depth and written to teach you about the various topics that play a role in a mobile internet setup. They're updated constantly as technology shifts. Our members also have access to our <u>Classroom</u>, walking them through the guides.
- Gear Center We track gear specific to mobile internet and overview the options on our radar. We try to get hands on time with a representative sampling, and share our more in-depth reviews & tutorials with our more bars.
- <u>Video Center</u> A lot of our content also has a video component to complement it from our news stories, guides to tutorials. Our members also can tune in a couple times a month for our interactive Q&A webinars.
- Forums Our premium members have access to our Q&A forums where we are pleased to assist them in their
 research. We also host the free & public <u>Internet for RVers & Cruiser</u> Facebook group, where our staff helps
 field basic questions.

We try to provide a lot of content on this website for free - to the public. We're only able to do so in thanks to the support we get from our premium members. In return, they get a lot of extra perks."

You might have noticed that they have a talent for clearly explaining things succinctly. A premium membership, auto-renewing subscription comes to \$69 a year, but there is a *lot* of free content if you chose not to subscribe. Their information has saved us some serious money.

55+ Cellular Telephone Plans

Mobile Internet Resources Center is where I learned about senior citizen cellular plans, and that is the other thing I want to share today. If you are over 55 and don't have a senior plan, you can save a bundle by getting one. Prices and terms vary by carrier. There may be add-ons that speak to your individual needs and preferences, such as if you want to be able to stream HD video or if you want to be have more hot-spot data to use with your laptop or other devices. T-Mobile started the ball rolling in 2017 by going *way* beyond the basic flip-phone service that had been the hallmark of senior plans until then. Now all the carriers are ramping up with similar plans which support everything you can do on a smart phone and with generous-to-unlimited data allowances.

Once you have yourself set up with a good plan there are bunches of apps and gadgets that can make your RV trips more enjoyable and complete. I'll be sharing some of my favorites in future newsletters.

Looking for a Ford Service Center that will work on your RV? https://fordcommercialvehiclecenter.com/findDealer/init Enter your location on the first page. Select "Additional Filters" at the top of the next page. Motorhomes are the xth selection from the left.

Motorhomes are the 4th selection from the left. Check "Class C. and "Apply Filter" at the bottom.

Are you traveling through Tennessee in the future? Tom and Sue Jackson ran across a unique attraction in Clinton Tennessee, the Museum of Appalachia. It's on Rt 61 just east of route 441. The outside grounds have old buildings and old machinery, and inside the main building are lots of local history, pictures and equipment that was used in the past. It also features many musical instruments that were hand made.

The website describes the museum: "The Museum of Appalachia is a living history museum — a pioneer mountain farm-village that lends voice to the people of Southern Appalachia through the artifacts and stories they left behind. Roam our 65 picturesque acres and experience a recreated Appalachian community complete with: 35 log cabins, barns, farm animals, churches, schools, gardens. Over 250,000 artifacts in 3 buildings, with vast collections of folk art, musical instruments, baskets, quilts, Native American artifacts, and more."

They also serve a lunch specializing in Southern Appalachian country cooking and have a Gift Shop featuring locally made products which Tom and Sue recommend. Across the street on an access road is the Chunky Monkey Ice Cream Shop, with great hamburgers and ice cream.

LINDA HENDERSON'S CHICKEN SPAGHETTI RECIPE

Linda graciously shared the recipe for the delicious spaghetti dish she brought to the pot luck. It got rave reviews!

Ingredients

- 2 pounds frozen boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 (16-ounce) package spaghetti
 1 (10-ounce) can Ro*Tel Tomatoes
- 2 (10.5-ounce) cans cream of mushroom soup
- 1 (16-ounce) package Velveeta cheese
- · 4 ounces cream cheese
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1 1/2 cups shredded sharp cheddar cheese

Instructions

Place the chicken in a large pot and just cover with water. Cook over medium-low heat until cooked through. Try not to boil the chicken as it can make it tough. Allow to cool enough to handle, then shred using two forks. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Lightly grease a 13x9-inch baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.

Cook the pasta according to the package directions. Drain and set aside. In a large pot, combine the Ro*tel with the juice, undiluted cream of mushroom soup, Velveeta cheese, and cream cheese. Heat over low heat, stirring constantly, until the cheeses have melted. Add the garlic powder and onion powder. Add the shredded chicken and cooked spaghetti. Mix well. Pour the mixture into the prepared dish and sprinkle with the shredded cheddar cheese.

Bake for 20 to 30 minutes or until heated through and the cheese has melted.
